




#1 Value in Louisiana Higher Education

Recently released <u>rankings</u> put LSU as best in Louisiana and a leader in the SEC in one of the most important outcomes to today's students: return on investment.


According to PayScale's 2017-18 College Salary Report, LSU alumni have the highest starting salaries of any public in-state university, as well as the third-highest in the SEC, behind only Texas A&M and Florida. Nationally, our graduates also fare well, ranking in the top half of public flagship universities.

LSU Freshman Kayne Finley has dreamed of attending LSU since he was a very small child, and he wasn't about to let a cancer diagnosis stop him. Early last year, Kayne was diagnosed with diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma (DIPG), a cancer of the brain stem, and doctors said his tumor was inoperable.
